New 9/22 for those Driving through New Brunswick: Effective today, anyone entering New Brunswick will need to complete the travel form. This includes all driving clients in the future as well as those that are presently in Newfoundland Hunting that will need to enter New Brunswick in order to get to NL or to return home. NOTE for those Driving: Point of Entry Officials have advised that **non-resident hunters** arriving via Marine Atlantic in Port aux Basques are presenting at the checkpoint with **Travel Forms not completed**. This is contributing to significant delay in the screening process and ultimately delays for the traveling public.

Please ask your members to remind clients that they must complete the Travel Form (<https://travel-declaration.nlchi.nl.ca/>) in advance of their travel date to avoid this unnecessary delay.

COVID-19: Entering Canada requirements checklist – Fully Vaccinated

As a fully vaccinated traveler here is what you need to prepare:

Before you travel Use the same email address for all your entry requirements, where applicable (that is, when registering for COVID-19 testing upon arrival and creating your ArriveCAN account).

Arriving in Canada Have the following items with you for assessment by a government official at the border:

✓ ArriveCAN receipt

✓ Proof of vaccination (either printed or digital copy)

✓ Pre-entry test results (either printed or digital copy)

✓ Other travel documents, including a quarantine plan

After arriving If you meet the requirements and are exempt from quarantine, you may travel by air or land to your destination.

You must:

✓ follow local public health measures;

✓ maintain a list of all close contacts for your first 14 days in Canada; and,

✓ keep copies of your proof of vaccination for 14 days.

Prior to leaving Canada / COVID-19 Testing Required for U.S. Entry Effective January 26, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) require all air passengers* two years of age and over entering the United States (including U.S. citizens and Legal Permanent Residents) to present a negative COVID-19 test, taken within three (3) calendar days of departure, or proof of recovery from the virus within the last 90 days.

Airlines must confirm the negative test result or proof of recent recovery for all passengers prior to boarding. Airlines must deny boarding of passengers who do not provide documentation of a negative test or recovery.

See the CDC Proof of Negative Test Result page to view the order, complete the attestation, and to see FAQ's. *Please note the requirements of this CDC order only apply to air travel into the US and does not apply to land border crossings.
